



## ***Coastal Heritage* Wins Communication Awards**

*Charleston, S.C.* — *Coastal Heritage*, a quarterly publication of the S.C. Sea Grant Consortium, recently won four awards.

The spring 2004 issue of *Coastal Heritage* won a Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) Grand Award for its outstanding content, graphic design and communication effectiveness. This issue covered Consortium program highlights from 2000-2004.

Three consecutive issues of *Coastal Heritage* won the Society for Technical Communication (STC)—Carolina Chapter Distinguished Award in the 2004-2005 technical publications category. According to STC competition judges, these issues are "Clearly superior work that apply the principles of technical communication in an outstanding way, particularly in the way it anticipates and fulfills the needs of its audience."

The winning entry then was judged at the 2004-2005 STC International competition, where it won an Excellence Award. Entries were drawn from chapters and regional competitions in the United States, Canada, 13 European nations, Australia and Israel. ***Coastal Heritage* received the competition's highest award given to a magazine this year.** Winning entries will be displayed at STC's 52<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference in Seattle, Washington, May 8-11.
